JUSTICE & PEACE

U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Urging Protection of Christians/Religious Minorities in Middle East:

The U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops ((USCCB) recently urged us to contact our U.S. Senators regarding HR 390, a bill that has passed the House of Representatives in June and is now awaiting action in the Senate.

The USCCB website suggests we urge our senators to "call for a vote and support passage of H.R. 390, the Iraq and Syria Genocide Emergency Relief and Accountability Act. Christians and other religious and ethnic minorities are in dire need of assistance, after having suffered horrendous persecution at the hands of extremists and been displaced from their homes and livelihoods, often multiple times."

"H.R. 390 will provide much needed assistance for survivors of genocide and would help direct U.S. support to faith-based organizations that are already providing humanitarian relief and rebuilding assistance to communities that suffered genocide. This bill would help ensure U.S. funding for genocide survivors and also seeks to hold those responsible for these atrocities accountable in order to prevent future genocides."

"H.R. 390 will help ensure the survival of religious minorities and help preserve the 2000 year presence of Christians in the Middle East. To focus attention on the plight of Christians and other minorities is not to ignore the suffering of others. Rather, by focusing on the most vulnerable members of society, we strengthen the entire fabric of society to protect the rights of all."

Dispelling Myths about Church Music

Father Christopher Smith's Article continues this week with Myth #5

“Myth 5. Vatican II abolished Latin in the Mass.

Vatican II's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy states, “The use of the Latin language is to be preserved.” The council fathers commanded the use of Latin while allowing for some use of the vernacular.

The same document also calls for the faithful to be able to sing parts of the Mass together in Latin. Latin gives the church a universal language.

In an increasingly mobile culture of globalization, Catholics able to follow the Mass in Latin and in their own tongue can actively participate in their church anywhere in the world. The use of Latin also frees us from being too narrow-minded and too centered on our own nation or culture; it connects us with our history and paves the way for our future.

The point of Latin is not to make the rites impossible to understand; it is to make real the universality of the church.

One can often see people at international Masses who can all make the Latin responses and sing some things together in Latin. A powerful experience of the church's unity is when we all sing with one voice the same words that Catholics have always sung at Mass.”
