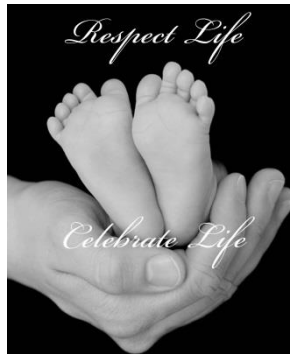

## JUSTICE & PEACE

### Early Voting has started!

Participation in voting is an important part of our responsibilities as Christian citizens. There are several ways you can make this easier if you have a busy schedule, health problems or any other obstacle that may make it difficult to vote on **Tuesday November 6.**

**Early voting** has started for the City of Reedsburg. You can vote at City Hall, located at **134 S. Locust St.** City Hall is open from 7:30 a.m. – 4 p.m. Monday – Friday. Early voting will be available all the way until Friday November 2 at 5 p.m. Please bring a photo ID when you vote. If you have not registered yet, you can register and then early vote. If you are going to register, also bring a document verifying your address.

Most of the surrounding communities have also started early voting, but you should check with your municipal officials. By law, early voting must be offered at least two weeks ahead of the election.

### Absentee Ballot:

If you are too ill or otherwise unable to come to the polls, you can request an absentee ballot. You can do this via the state voting website

<https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/>

An absentee ballot will be mailed to you. You do not need to provide identification for this process; however, you will need to have one witness who is from the State of Wisconsin. (See absentee ballot for info.)

## KNOW YOUR LITURGY

### Why We Sing at Mass.

“A cry from deep within our being, music is a way for God to lead us to the realm of higher things.<sup>3</sup> As St. Augustine says, “Singing is for the one who loves.”<sup>4</sup> Music is therefore a sign of God’s love for us and of our love for him. In this sense, it is very personal. But unless music sounds, it is not music, and whenever it sounds, it is accessible to others. By its very nature song has both an individual and a communal dimension. Thus, it is no wonder that singing together in church expresses so well the sacramental presence of God to his people.” [*Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship*, 71]
