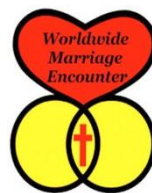

KNOW YOUR LITURGY

What does "going to adoration" mean?

"Going to adoration" may mean participating in the Exposition & Benediction rites that begin and end Eucharistic Adoration and/or spending time in prayer before the exposed Eucharist. This may include a short prayerful visit or a holy hour. Exposition includes the removal of a sacred host from the tabernacle by a priest or deacon and placing it in a vessel called a monstrance. The monstrance is then placed on the altar while the people sing "O Saving Victim ("O Salutaris") or another suitable song. The celebrant then incenses the Blessed Sacrament and leaves the altar if the adoration period is lengthy. Adoration occurs for the designated amount of time (which may be an hour, all day, several days, or longer—even perpetual). While the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, people may stay to pray or come at any time during the exposition to pray. During the exposition, there may be prayers, songs, Scripture readings and even a homily). At the end of the exposition, the celebrant goes to the altar and kneels while the "Tantum Ergo" (Down in Adoration Falling") is sung. The celebrant then blesses the people with the Eucharist and replaces the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. Then the "Blessed be God" is recited. As the celebrant leaves "Holy God" or another suitable song is sung.

September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

In recent years, we've been reminded often of the importance of checking in with our friends and family that seem happy – that sometimes a smile can mask deep inner turmoil. The suicides of famously "happy" figures like Robin Williams and Kate Spade serve as evidence.

However, when it comes to those people we're closest to, there are often signs of potential self-harm or suicidal thoughts we can see, and we all have the power to make a difference. In honor of National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, SSM Health is offering advice on what to do if someone you know is in crisis.

If suicide is imminent or has already been attempted, call 911 immediately and stay with the person until emergency assistance arrives. If someone you know indicates he or she is considering ending his or her life, or if you see signs that you believe they could be preparing to do so, the following steps can be helpful:

- **Help connect them with a professional:** Offer to help the person find a local licensed professional to speak with, and even offer a ride or to attend an appointment with them.
- **Let them know you're there for them:** Ask questions, listen carefully and learn how you can be supportive in a way that will make them feel better. Don't promise to keep their feelings secret, but do promise to act in their best interests.
- **Avoid bringing humor or negativity to the situation:** Often, suicidal persons feel isolated and may be the victims of bullying or other negative behaviors. Avoid trying to lighten the situation with a joke or dismissing their needs – this is a time to take things seriously.
- **Direct them to the National Suicide Prevention Hotline:** If you're at a distance or don't know the person well, refer them to trained professionals available for confidential counseling at 1-800-273-8255 (open 24 hours per day, 365 days per year).

I am thankful that we have the opportunity to join you in lifting up the name of Jesus to Reedsburg, and sharing His love and mercy to a world in such desperate need of the Gospel of Grace. I pray a prayer of blessing for your Church and for your families, and I look forward to partnering with you in service to our community and each other as brothers and sisters in Christ. JUSTICE & PEACE

National Interest: Bishops Oppose Asylum Rule.

The U.S. Catholic Bishops have recently written to the Depts. of Justice and Homeland Security asking them to rescind the eligibility changes for asylum in the U.S. The new ruling says that, with limited exceptions, an alien who enters or attempts to enter the United States across the southern border after failing to apply for protection in a third country (outside the alien's country of citizenship, nationality, or last lawful habitual residence through which the alien transited en route to the United States) is *not* eligible for asylum. This ruling is contrary to domestic & international asylum laws and makes it very difficult for anyone fleeing oppression to find safety in our country. We are asked to support our bishops in their statements and work for this humanitarian cause.
